Activity and Financial Report

For the year ended 31 December 2004

This report is presented along with the financial statements of the organisation for the year ended 31 December 2004. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements.

Objects & Policies

Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) is an international non-governmental medical-humanitarian organisation. We provide independent medical relief to victims of war, disasters, epidemics and other catastrophes in over 70 countries around the world. We strive to provide assistance to those who need it most, regardless of ethnic origin, religion or political affiliation. To get access to and care for the most vulnerable, MSF's operational policies must remain scrupulously independent of governments, as well as religious and economic powers. We rely on private individuals for the majority of our funding. In the field, we conduct our own assessments, manage projects directly and monitor the impact of our assistance. We also campaign for improved access to medicines for the most vulnerable groups and fund research into the development of drugs for neglected diseases.

MSF is a voluntary organisation. Each year about 2,500 doctors, nurses, logistics specialists and engineers of all nationalities leave on field assignments to join around 22,000 staff in the countries of assistance.

Organisational Structure

Initially founded in Paris in 1971, MSF has become an international organisation with nineteen sections throughout the world. Each section is an association. Twice a year the president of each section attends the MSF International Council, which is an association, registered in Switzerland. This Council has, amongst others, the responsibility to promote accountability and transparency within the MSF movement; These accounts are a reflection of that responsibility and reflect the financial situation of the movement as a whole. It should be noted that the financial accounts include 18 sections rather than 19 sections as MSF Greece rejoined the movement in January 2005. All those working with MSF agree to abide by the principles of the International Charter of MSF as follows:

The charter of Médecins sans Frontières

Médecins Sans Frontières is a private international association. The association is made up mainly of doctors and health sector workers and is also open to all other professions which might help in achieving its aims. All of its members agree to honor the following principles:

- Médecins Sans Frontières provides assistance to populations in distress, to victims of natural or man-made disasters and to victims of armed conflict. They do so irrespective of race religion, creed or political convictions.
- Médecins Sans Frontières observes neutrality and impartiality in the name of universal medical ethics and the right to humanitarian assistance and claims full and unhindered freedom in the exercise of its functions.
- Members undertake to respect their professional code of ethics and to maintain complete independence from all political, economic or religious powers.
- As volunteers, members understand the risks and dangers of the missions they carry out and make no claim for themselves or their assigns for any form of compensation other than that which the association might be able to afford them.

The Year in Review

On 26 December 2004 shortly after a tsunami ravaged the coasts of South Asia, leaving more than 300,000 people dead and thousands more injured and homeless, more than 200 MSF international volunteers and hundreds of national staff rushed to the hardest-hit areas, especially Indonesia and Sri Lanka. Within 72 hours, our first teams began working in conjunction with national efforts to provide emergency relief to thousands of people affected by the disaster. MSF's response included providing medical staff and materials to existing health facilities, running mobile clinics where no health care was available, setting up emergency water and sanitation systems where displaced people were gathering, distributing essential relief items, and once initial medical needs had been met, giving psychosocial assistance to those traumatized by the event and its consequences.

Its supporters guaranteed MSF's independence

In sharp contrast to virtually every other catastrophe that humanitarian organizations addressed in the past year, the tsunami generated an exceptional outpouring of goodwill, solidarity and generosity on an international level. Less than a week after the tsunami, MSF estimated that it had received more than sufficient funds for its foreseen emergency medical activities in the region and asked donors instead to contribute to our work in other emergencies. This – at the time – radical stance is an illustration of our understanding of financial transparency and our own particular role in this type of crisis.

MSF also approached its donors worldwide to request their permission to use their donations in other crisis situations such as Niger, Somalia, Columbia or the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), where huge numbers of people continue to suffer year after year in deafening silence. Our supporters were overwhelmingly positive giving us the resources to respond quickly and effectively to crises during 2005

It is the ongoing support of thousands of individuals that makes it possible for MSF to assess needs and provide medical relief within hours of a disaster or a crisis. MSF can start working without having to wait for the international community to wake up to the crisis or for institutional donors to release funds. Thanks to its supporters, MSF can retain its independence and intervene when and where our assistance is most needed. This impartiality and independence of analysis and action are crucial elements of MSF's identity that must be upheld despite the changing landscape of humanitarian aid.

Assisting those in conflict zones

One conflict in which MSF's neutrality has been so crucial is in the DRC, where, for the majority of the people, the so-called transition from war to peace remained little more than a mirage during 2004. Thousands continued to die from treatable diseases such as malaria and measles. Violence continued to flare, trapping those living in the provinces of Ituri, North and South Kivu and Katanga. For example in Bunia, Ituri surgeons operated on adults and children who had survived gunshot wounds, machete attacks, burns and sexual violence and the multi-disciplinary team has cared for over 1000 women who have been raped, an horrific side effect of the prevailing situation. Elsewhere in the DRC, MSF teams provided hospital and basic care to local populations and people displaced by violence. Their activities spanned from giving nutritional and medical assistance to malnourished children to providing psychological counselling to victims of war.

In Colombia, people have been forced for decades to live amid violent confrontations among government forces, paramilitary groups and armed guerrillas, which have terrorized and targeted civilians in both rural and urban areas. In its projects around the country, MSF tries to alleviate some of the suffering by bringing medical services, including psychological care, to vulnerable and displaced civilians. Similarly, in the Haïtian

capital of Port au Prince, civilians have also been caught in the crossfire of political and criminal violence that has wracked their city in waves since September 2004. While living conditions in several of the poorest neighbourhoods deteriorate and brutal attacks intensify, the number of people who have been injured by violent acts – and who have received emergency medical and surgical care from MSF – continues to grow.

Calling attention to Darfur's ongoing violence

Today, approximately two years after violence broke out in Sudan's western region of Darfur, the conflict has faded from the media. But the terror it inflicts on civilians remains everpresent. Many of those gathered in camps within Sudan or just across the border in eastern Chad see no end in sight to their plight, and repeated village burnings, sexual violence and attacks have made returning home an unrealistic option for most. Yet the camps or villages in which they have gathered are far from secure. People living in these areas continue to be subjected to repeated aggression and recurring displacement. From a slow and difficult start MSF expanded its assistance from a small team overwhelmed by the needs of a camp of 80,000 people to assisting more than one million people who were forced to flee their homes or were otherwise affected by the violence and its consequences.

In addition to the medical care provided, MSF spoke out on a number of occasions, including before the UN Security Council, on what our teams have witnessed in Darfur. MSF described both the inadequate a slow humanitarian response, as well as the active obstruction by the Sudanese government throughout the year, and published data reflecting the high mortality and suffering experienced by the people of Darfur, both as they escaped the destruction of their villages and, once they arrived in and around the camps. These descriptions have both personal and institutional risks, but our volunteers see it as a responsibility to make people and governments aware of the abuses they witness. To remain silent is unacceptable and impossible.

Promoting better care for those with neglected

Every day, in countries around the world, MSF confronts another form of violence that touches millions. Patients living with diseases such as malaria, tuberculosis (TB), HIV/AIDS, sleeping sickness and Chagas disease, to name only a few, die simply because the medicines needed to treat them are not available in sufficient quantities, are too expensive or do not even exist. Currently, there is little evidence of urgency to increase the supply of crucial medicines, find new treatments or develop better diagnostic tools for classic killers such as malaria. In recent years, there has been a timid resurgence of research on these diseases, however, considering the decades of neglect, these improvements are precarious and disproportionately minor for patients awaiting diagnosis and treatment today. While MSF and many others have shown that it is possible to

treat HIV-positive adults - even those living in very resourcepoor settings – the same has not been true for the disease's youngest victims. Today our efforts to treat children infected with HIV/AIDS are severely hampered by a lack of appropriate drug formulations and diagnostic tools. The HIV tests currently available in developing countries do not work in infants younger than 18 months old. Half of all children with AIDS never reach their second birthdays. Despite the fact that MSF is now successfully treating more than 30,000 patients in 27 countries, our field teams are forced to devise makeshift solutions, such as breaking adult pills in two or struggling to get young children to swallow syrups frequently, to treat them. For HIV/ AIDS patients who are also infected with TB (the most common opportunistic infection accompanying HIV/AIDS), the obstacles are just as high. Problems in diagnosing TB, high pill loads, drug interactions, and the lack of coordinated care are some of the difficulties facing our medical teams in various countries, especially in parts of southern Africa, where both diseases kill thousands every year. However it is now clear that it is possible to successfully integrate HIV/AIDS and TB care. In countries such as South Africa, some important headway has enabled extremely ill patients to regain their health and restart their

Fulfilling our commitments

Whether caring for an HIV/AIDS patient co-infected with TB, a gunshot victim in DRC or Haiti, or a malnourished child in Niger whose family is unable to pay for food or medical assistance, MSF continues to strive to bring medical assistance to those who most need it. Yet our ability to gain access to people in need is challenged by the abuse of humanitarian symbols for political purposes, and the concurrent violence against humanitarian aid workers themselves. Discourse concerning the responsibility of states in respecting the role of impartial humanitarian action and the need for action based on principles has lead to MSF being accused at times of being "old fashioned" and even extremist for reaffirming its basic principles in an evolving world. However, it is the use of these very principles to interpret and respond to a changing environment that allows us to carry out pragmatic actions under such conditions. The challenge is the merging of principles and pragmatism in many different contexts and different ways. In the end, we have one goal in mind: to provide medical assistance to those who need it, whatever the circumstances.

Combined Accounts 2004

MSF is pleased to present its first set of audited combined financial accounts. The combined accounts present an aggregation of financial statements of 18 MSF sections worldwide together with the financial statements of 12 satellite organisations. The financial accounts provide both a view of MSF's work internationally and also a means of transparency and accountability.

MSF has long desired to produce complete audited combined accounts for all its international operations in an effort to increase transparency and accountability to the populations for whom we work, for donors and volunteers alike.

Combining the audited accounts of all the MSF sections and satellites has been a challenge and we are grateful to all those involved in completing this project.

Income

2004 saw an increase in income for MSF internationally. MSF received an increase in income of € 76 million, an increase of 19.9% on 2003. MSF's total income for the year 2004 was € 458 million. We would like to take this opportunity to most sincerely thank all our donors for their continued support without whom we would be unable to work for the populations, which we serve.

Expenditure

Having outlined the funds available to MSF in 2004, the combined accounts also show the disbursements of those funds. The total expenditure in 2004 was € 421 million. This expenditure can be broken down into two main categories being social mission and other expenses. The table below breaks down these categories further and allocates expenditure accordingly.

The result of the above is that MSFs total expenditure 2004 is represented by 82% spent on social mission and 18% other expenses.

Tsunami Related Donations – Ten months financial overview

The Asian Tsunami on the 26th December 2004, lead to an enormous response from the general public worldwide. As this report is written, the first anniversary of the Tsunami is imminent and hopefully the review below will be helpful. In an extraordinary outpouring of support, MSF sections worldwide received € 110 million in donations to provide emergency relief to people affected by the tsunami. By the end of September 2005, MSF had spent € 22 million on tsunami-related operations in South Asia. In total the organisation will most likely spend € 24.3 million for activities in the regions affected by the tsunami in 2004 and 2005. The 2004 financial statements include € 2 million of Tsunami related donations; the balance will be reflected in the 2005 accounts.

The generosity of hundreds of thousands of MSF donors worldwide made it possible for MSF teams to begin assessing the needs and providing medical relief in the most-affected areas of Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and other countries within 48 hours of the disaster.

Less than a week after the tsunami, estimating that we had already received sufficient funds for our foreseen emergency activities, MSF began asking donors to stop giving donations for MSF's response to this particular emergency. Instead they were encouraged to support our work providing medical care in other emergencies and ongoing conflicts such as DRCongo, Somalia or the Darfur region of Sudan.

MSF offices around the world also began contacting individuals requesting their permission to use their funds to support MSF's work in emergencies elsewhere in the world. This process is still ongoing, but so far an overwhelming majority of the donors has accepted that we use their donations elsewhere. At the end of October, 70% of the funds initially received for the emergency can be used to support MSF's other emergency programs around the world such as in Niger and Pakistan today. MSF seeks to derestrict a further 7% of the donations and 1% has been refunded on request.

MSF is extremely grateful for the unprecedented surge of spontaneous donations we received following the tsunami disaster and will continue to use this money to provide medical and psychosocial care in the regions affected by the tsunami. At the same time, we are heartened by the trust our supporters have placed in us in allowing us to use their funds where they are needed most. We believe that being open and transparent with our donors about how we use their funds is essential, as it is their support that allows us to alleviate the suffering of the most vulnerable in the worst conflicts and disasters around the world

Auditors' Report

Year ended 31st December 2004

We have audited the accompanying international combined balance sheet of Médecins sans Frontières Movement as of 31st December 2004, and the related international combined statements of income, changes in equity and cash flows for the year then ended. These international combined financial statements are the responsibility of the Movement's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these international combined financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing. Those Standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Based on our audit, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying international combined financial statements set up in accordance with Médecins sans Frontières accounting policies do not present fairly, in all material respects the financial position of the Movement as of 31st December 2004, and of the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year ended.

Without qualifying our opinion we draw attention to the following points:

- the international combined financial statements as of 31st December 2004 present non audited figures for the year ended 31 December 2003;
- the note 1 Significant Accounting Policies to the international combined financial statements

present the main deviations from the International Financial Reporting Standards and SIC interpretations in the Médecins sans Frontières accounting policies.

Notes to the financial statements Introduction

Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) is an international humanitarian aid organisation that provides emergency medical assistance to populations in danger in more than 70 countries. In countries where health structures are insufficient or even non-existent, MSF collaborates with authorities such as the Ministry of Health to provide assistance. MSF works in rehabilitation of hospitals and dispensaries, vaccination programmes and water and sanitation projects. MSF also works in remote health care centres, slum areas and provides training of local personnel. All this is done with the objective of rebuilding health structures to acceptable levels.

In carrying out humanitarian assistance, MSF seeks also to raise awareness of crisis situations; MSF acts as a witness and will speak out, either in private or in public about the plight of populations in danger for whom MSF works. In doing so, MSF sets out to alleviate human suffering, to protect life and health and to restore and ensure respect for the human beings and their fundamental human rights.

It is part of MSF's work to address any violations of basic human rights encountered by field teams, violations perpetrated or sustained by political actors. It does so by confronting the responsible actors themselves, by putting pressure on them through mobilisation of the international community and by issuing information publicly. In order to prevent compromise or manipulation of MSF's relief activities, MSF maintains neutrality and independence from individual governments. The organisation also tries to ensure that the majority of funds raised for its work comes directly from contributions from the general public. In this way, MSF guarantees equal access to its humanitarian assistance.

MSF has been setting up emergency medical aid missions around the world since 1971.

Médecins Sans Frontières is a private, not-for-profit, international organization. It is comprised of 19 national sections in Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Hong Kong, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, Norway, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, the United States, and - since January 2005 - Greece, and an international office in Geneva. The search for efficiency has led MSF to create 12 specialized organizations - called "satellites" - in charge of specific activities such as humanitarian relief supplies, epidemiological and medical research studies, and research on humanitarian and social action. These satellites, considered as related parties to the sections include: Transfer in Belgium, MSF-Logistique, Epicentre, Fondation MSF, Etat d'Urgence Production, Urgence et Développement Alimentaire, MSF Assistance, SCI MSF, SCI Sabin in France, MSF-Luxembourg Etablissement d'Utilité Publique in Luxembourg, MSF Foundation Kikin in Japan, and MSF Enterprises Limited in the United Kingdom.

1 Significant accounting policies

A combination aggregates the financial statements of several separate entities without investment relationships into a single group whereas a consolidation collates different affiliates of a single parent entity in its financial statements.

All the previously listed entities are included in the combination perimeter. The resulting combined financial statements comprise:

- a statement of financial position,
- · a statement of financial activities,
- a statement of functional expenses,
- a statement of cash-flows,
- a statement showing changes in retained earnings and equities,
- the notes to the financial statements.

The combined financial statements have been prepared in accordance with and comply with the MSF accounting stand-

Although the International Accounting Standards (IAS) - also called International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) - do not contain specific guidelines for not-for-profit and non-governmental organizations concerning the accounting treatment (of non-reciprocal transfers in particular) and the presentation of the financial statements, MSF accounting standards are in compliance with most of the IFRS as adopted by the International Standards Board (IASB) and interpretations issued by the Standing Interpretations Committee (SIC) of the IASB. Main deviations to the IFRS relate to IAS 17 (Leases) for the depreciation policy used, to IAS 19 (Employee Benefits) and to IAS 39 (Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement). 2004 is the first publication of MSF combined financial statements. In accordance with IAS/IFRS principles, the financial statements of the previous year are restated according to MSF standards for comparison purposes but have not been audited.

1.1 Basis of presentation

The financial statements are presented in euros, rounded to the nearest thousand. They are prepared on the historical costs convention, revaluated at their fair value, with the exception of tangible and intangible assets.

The financial statements have been prepared and presented according to the principles of fair presentation, accruals, matching, going concern, consistency and prudence. Figures are rounded and therefore may vary slightly from the amounts presented in other documents or may result in rounding off addition differences.

1.2 Foreign currency translation

The combined statement of financial position is translated into euros at the year-end rate. The combined statement of financial activities and statement of functional expenses are converted at the average rate for the current year. The main exchange rates compared to euro are the following:

1.3 Change in accounting policies

The 2004 financial statements do not contain any changes in accounting policies compared to 2003.

1.4 Intangible assets and property, plant and equipment

Intangible assets are recorded at historical value and depreciated on a straight-line basis over a 3-years period.

Property, plant and equipment are recorded at their acquisition cost, including incidental expenses. They are depreciated according to the straight-line method and their estimated useful lives as follows:

- Land: no depreciation,
- Buildings: 50 years,
- Fixtures: 5 years,
- Furniture, computers, machinery and equipment: 3 to 5 years,
- Other tangible assets: 3 to 10 years.

Purchase costs of fixed assets used in the field for programs purposes are directly charged to program expenses because of their accelerated useful life.

Finance lease

Assets acquired under long term finance leases are capitalized and recorded in the statement of financial position as tangible fixed assets. They are depreciated over the shorter of their estimated useful life and the lease term. The associated obligations are included in financial debts.

1.5 Financial assets

Long-term investments are stated at fair value. Other financial assets are recorded at historical cost.

1.6 Inventories

Inventories held in headquarters and satellites are recorded at weighted average of purchase prices.

All goods and materials present in the field are recognized as expenditure when transferred from headquarters and satellites to the field or when bought locally.

Appropriate depreciation amounts are booked depending on stock coverage, expiration date, and damaged items.

1.7 Receivables and other assets

Grants receivable correspond to funds owed to MSF by third parties according to a formal agreement.

They result from the differences between the cumulated allowable expenses incurred and the money received for each of these agreements.

Contributions receivable include donations not yet received for which MSF is certain to collect the money, but also legacies and bequests received and designated for disposal. Donations are accounted for at historical value and legacies and bequests at their best estimated amount.

Other receivables and other assets are recorded at their historical value.

1.8 Cash and equivalents

MSF considers short-term deposits, cash in headquarters and cash in the field as cash and equivalents. They are recorded at historical value or at fair value depending on their natures. For the statement of cash flows, overdrafts are included as a negative component of cash and equivalents.

1.9 Provisions and contingent liabilities

Provisions and contingent liabilities are valued at their best estimate when MSF has a legal or constructive obligation as the result of a past event, and if it is probable that an outflow of assets will be required to settle the provision. The financial statements do not contain any provisions concerning employee benefits.

1.10 Financial debts, accounts payable and accrued expenses

The financial debts are recorded at their historical value. Trade accounts payable to suppliers are recorded on an invoice basis when the invoices are received before year-end, or on the basis of their best estimate if no invoices are received before yearend. Accrued personnel expenses are valued at cost, except for provisions valued at their best estimate. Grants payable and other debts are accounted for at their nominal value.

1.11 Deferred income

Deferred income on public institutional and private grants are recognized on the basis of the difference between the cash received and the cumulated allowable expenses incurred for each of the formal agreements concerned.

Unspent restricted donations represent contributions received with a specific earmarking but which haven't been used at

1.12 Retained earnings and equities

Retained earnings represent the cumulated surpluses and deficits of the previous years, including those resulting from the current year.

They are composed of:

- Permanently restricted funds, which may be capital funds, where the assets are required by the donors to be invested or retained for actual use, rather than expended, or which may be the minimum compulsory level of retained earnings to be maintained in some countries.
- Unrestricted funds, which are unspent donor nondesignated funds expendable at the discretion of MSF's trustees in furtherance of our social mission.

Other retained earnings and equities represent foundations' capital, combination restatements between certain sections and satellites and translation adjustments (for the combination restatements related to exchange rate differences).

1.13 Income

MSF's income comprises contributions from public generosity and public institutional bodies, as well as revenues from other

Private income is provided by individuals and private organizations (companies, trusts and foundations, and other not-forprofit organizations). Public institutional income represents grants (i.e. contributions based on contracts for specific projects), subsidies and donations received or pledged directly from / by public institutional bodies such as governments or multi-lateral agencies. Income from other activities mainly results from merchandising, equipment and services provided to other organizations, and financial transations.

Income is considered restricted only when subject to a donorimposed restriction. Donors include all the external parties which contribute to MSF's resources. A donor-imposed restriction is a stipulation and limitation in the use of contributed assets or monetary donations. These restriction can be limited to purpose (country, project, type of intervention, specific activities), time or specific wishes (vaccines...). Donations with donor-imposed restrictions are reported as restricted for their full amount. Unspent restricted donations are carried forward as deferred income. Grants are reported as restricted for the allowable expenses incurred in the current year.

Donations are based on non-reciprocal transfers of cash or other assets, or cancellation of liabilities. They are recognized upon cash receipt.

2 Statement of financial position

Legacies and bequests

If restricted by a donors' will for use by the organization (selling or distribution forbidden), legacies and bequests are accounted for as restricted income and as the appropriate nature of asset (building, other financial assets, other inventories) when accepted by the board for their estimated amount.

If not restricted by donors, legacies and bequests are accounted for upon realization (i.e. cash receipt).

Grants are recognized as income for the allowable expenses incurred in the current year. At year-end, the difference between the cash received and the cumulated expenses incurred is accounted for as grants receivable or deferred

In-kind donations and services

In-kind donations and services are not valued and therefore not accounted for in the statement of financial activities. As MSF is an international movement, an aggregate of the in-kind contributions and services valued at average market prices or valued at the market prices in force in the different countries would have been meaningless and misleading in terms of comparability.

Volunteerism is not valued either because it represents one of the bases of MSF charter and principles. From a volunteer's standpoint, this involvement is a personal choice that a valuation at a market price denies. From MSF's standpoint, this is also a choice made in accordance with its principles, and a monetarization of this involvement would not represent a fair indicator of the services provided by the volunteers. However, an inventory of volunteers' assistance is presented in the notes 4.2.3 and 5.2.

1.14 Expenditure

Expenses are allocated according to the full cost method. The principle of the full cost method is to collate under each expenses' category, not only the direct costs that are specifically associated with it (direct allowable costs), but also an apportionment of the indirect costs (overheads).

All expenditure categories include therefore salaries, direct costs and allocated overheads (building costs, depreciation...).

The government of the Netherlands presented a claim before Geneva's court of first instance ordering MSF-Switzerland to pay 770 thousand euro (resulting in interest of 5% as of 15 June 2004). MSF-Switzerland opposes this claim and has in turn submitted a reconventional claim demanding that the government of the Netherlands restore the sum of 230 thousand euro held in its account. After an exchange of documents,

inquiry began in spring 2005. No provision has been created regarding the demand of the government of the Netherlands. The receivable of 230 thousand euro is not recognized among MSF's assets. The probability exists that the government of the Netherlands will have to reimburse this amount at the end of the suit.

Other countries or restrictions represent either the countries for which restricted funds lower than one thousand euro remain unspent, or transversal restrictions. They mainly include:

- a contribution of 841 thousand euro earmarked to the purchase of meningitis vaccines. These vaccines have actually been bought but are not used at year-end. The donation will be recognized as income when they will be consumed.
- a donation of 188 thousand euro restricted to the construction of a logistics warehouse and recognized as income on the same rythm as the related depreciations,
- annuity trusts of 155 thousand euro.

2.14 Retained earnings and equities

MSF's retained earnings have been built up over the years by surpluses of income over expenses. As of end of 2004, their available part (the unrestricted funds decreased by the translation adjustment) represents 6,6 months of activity. The purpose of maintaining retained earnings is to meet the following needs: future major humanitarian emergencies for which sufficient funding cannot be obtained, and/or a sudden drop of private and/or public institutional funding, and the sustainability of long-term programs (e.g. ARV treatments programs), as well as the prefinancing of operations to be funded by upcoming public funding campaigns and/or by public institutional funding. Other movements mainly include a 2.795 thousand euro reclassification from permanently restricted funds to unrestricted funds. They represent the impairment of a permanently restricted legacy from which no earnings can be realized. The impairment charge is included in management, general and administration for the same amount.

Headquarters program support

Headquarters program support relates to headquarters expenses incurred in order to carry out MSF humanitarian operations (e.g. project design, monitoring and evaluation, recruitment of expatriates, activities designated to improve the quality and the effectiveness of MSF operations).

Témoignage / awareness-raising

Témoignage / awareness-raising activities comprise expenses incurred by MSF in an educational manner in the furtherance of its social mission. They represent the situations where MSF acts as a witness and speaks out about the plight of the populations it serves through trying to mobilize of the international community and by issuing information publicly in order to inform, put pressure on responsible actors and stimulate

action. Too often in the countries where MSF works, we cannot treat our patients because the medicines are too expensive or they are no longer produced. Sometimes, the only drugs we have are toxic or ineffective, and nobody is looking for a better cure. As a medical humanitarian organization, it is fundamentally unacceptable to MSF that access to essential medicines is increasingly impossible, particularly for the common global infectious diseases. Since 1999, MSF has been campaigning internationally to find long-term, sustainable solutions to this crisis. The Campaign is pushing to lower the prices of existing medicines, to bring abondoned drugs back into production, to stimulate research and development for diseases that primarly affect the poor, and to overcome other barriers to access. In 2004, the Access to Essential Medicines Campaign contributed for 18% to the témoignage / awareness-raising expenses.

Programs relate to the aid projects undertaken by MSF and include the direct expenses incurred in the different countries of intervention. Logistics satellites' activities represent the indirect costs dedicated to the projects and associated with the delivery of emergency relief supplies.

For the year 2004, 277.319 thousand euro were spent in direct connection with the projects and logistics satellites' activities stood at 5.877 thousand euro.

These expenses were funded by 98.536 thousand euro coming from public institutional bodies, the balance by unrestricted and restricted private funds.

The difference of 4.354 thousand euro between public institu-

tional income as stated in the statement of financial activities and the amount above-mentioned represents the funding of headquarters expenses and of activities directly undertaken at headquarters level. This breakdown was not realized in the 2003 restated figures.

Staff information is expressed in full-time equivalent. When full-time equivalent cannot be provided, an average number of people is taken into account.

Figures for the previous year are presented in total for comparative purposes. They are not presented in the following disclosures for the different countries / regions of interventions because of the emergency nature of MSF's action.

5.1 Commitments

Legacies and bequests

Unrestricted legacies and bequests are accounted for upon realization (i.e. on receipt of cash). At the end of the current year, an estimated amount of 18.127 thousand euro has not been realized and is therefore not included in the financial statements.

Some of the programs are partly financed by public institutional grants. These grants may cover a more than one-year period and may not match with the financial year. The following disclosure presents the amount that MSF has committed to spend according to proposals agreed by the different bodies.

Guarantees given refer to loan agreements for 5.259 thousand euro, to rental contracts for 452 thousand euro, and for other purposes for 468 thousand euro. Other off balance-sheet commitments given mainly relate to rental contracts for office buildings.

In addition, MSF participated to the establishment of the Drugs for Neglected Diseases initiative (DNDi) with six other organizations: five public sector institutions - the Oswaldo Cruz Foundation from Brazil, the Indian Council for Medical Research, the Kenya Medical Research Institute, the Ministry of Health of Malaysia and France's Pasteur Institute - and one international research organization, the UNDP/World Bank/ WHO's Special Programme for Research and Training in Tropical Diseases (TDR), which acts as a permanent observer to the initiative.

The DNDi became a legal entity in July 2003. The International Council didn't consider MSF as a permanent solution to the R&D crises. MSF's involvement will therefore be limited both financially and in the time, the goal being to catalyse and help creating this initiative which, in due time, will work independently of MSF. Accordingly, MSF committed itself to an involvement as a founding member in the DNDi, but this commitment was limited up to five years and financially to not more than 3% of the total MSF annual expenditure.

Through an innovative partnership concluded between the DNDi and Sanofi-Aventis in April 2005, a new medicine to treat malaria will be developped. This is a fixed-dose combination (FDC) of artesunate and amodiaquine (AS/AQ) which is easier to use and cheaper than other combinations currently available (target price set at below one dollar for adults and 50 cents for children). This drug is expected to become available to patients in 2006.

5.3 Subsequent events

Asia tsunami disaster

On 26 December 2005, a powerfull earthquake off the coast of Sumatra created an enormous tsunami that swept over parts of South Asia, killing more than 300.000 people and leaving behind unimaginable destruction and suffering. Hundreds of kilometers of coastline were destroyed. Houses, boats and infrastructure were washed away.

Two days later, MSF started, in connection with national efforts, to provide emergency assistance to individuals in needs of medical care, food, clean water, shelter and other basic necessities. The majority of MSF's work was carried out in devastated communities in Indonesia and Sri Lanka, although staff also provided help to people in Thailand and India. Initial exploratory teams assessed the needs for aid in Malaysia, Myanmar, Bangladesh and Somalia, but did not find any serious unmet medical needs.

In an extraordinary show of support, the public contributed to an estimated amount of 110 million euros - of which 36.4 received for the year 2004, the balance in 2005 - in donations to MSF to provide emergency relief to people affected by the tsunami. These funds will be used for funding tsunami relief operations or derestricted with the consent of the donors and spent on forgotten crises and emergencies in line with MSF on-going work.

It is expected that MSF will spend 24.3 million euros in 2004 and 2005 on operations in the regions affected by the tsunami, with 19.4 million euros in Indonesia, 4.1 in Sri Lanka and 0.8 in India, Malaysia, and Thailand. Expenditure stands at 22.1 million euros at the end of September.

In the last week of December, 2.136 thousand euro were used and recognized as income. The remaining donations received for the year 2004 are carried in deferred income (total amount of 34.285 thousand euro) and are presented in the liabilities as unspent temporarily restricted funds.

The Greek section of MSF

The Greek section was reintegrated into the international movement in January 2005. It is not included in the scope of the 2004 combined financial statements presented here. However, for information purposes, its total expenditure reached, for the year 2004, 5.254 thousand euro (of which 78.8% devoted to the social mission), its total income 4.527 thousands of euros (of which 84.6% came from non public institutional sources), and its total year-end position to 5.264 thousand euro of which 3.909 as retained earnings and equi-

During the year 2004, MSF-Greece intervened in Armenia, Ethiopia, Greece, Malawi, Palestinian territories, Serbia and Montenegro, Sudan and Zambia.

Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) was founded in 1971 by a small group of doctors and journalists who believed that all people should have access to emergency relief. MSF was one of the first nongovernmental organizations to provide urgently needed medical assistance and to publicly bear witness to the plight of the people it helps.

Today MSF is an international medical humanitarian movement with branch offices in 19 countries. In 2004, MSF volunteer doctors, nurses, other medical professionals, logistical experts, water-and-sanitation engineers and administrators departed on more than 3,800 missions and joined approximately 22,500 locally hired staff to provide medical aid in over 70 countries.

MSF was awarded the 1999 Nobel Peace Prize.
